



ATTENTION FOODIES!

The announcement of the Supper Club has generated a flurry of excitement and understandably a few more questions as well. This fall we plan to roll out our new Supper Club featuring a 3-4 course dining experience with wine pairings served in the Overlook Dining Room. Supper Club members will be able to indulge their palates weekly Nov thru Apr with cuisine and wines from regions around the world. Each of these special yet casual evenings will include light entertainment, cocktails and appetizers, main entrée with tasty accompaniments followed by a scrumptious dessert. Wine vendors will visit periodically for tastings and opportunities to purchase wine at preferred prices.

Here are a few frequently asked questions with answers:

Which day of the week will the Supper Club dine?

Supper Club dinners will be offered weekly on either a Wednesday or a Thursday. As we get closer, we'll poll interested parties and decide which day works best or if it will fluctuate (like Wednesdays in Nov, Thursdays in Dec, or perhaps two Wed and two Thurs per month). Either way, it will be published in advance so people can plan ahead.

What is the price range of a typical dinner?

Price range will be approximately \$25-40 (most in the \$25-30 range) depending upon the food items and market price (plus tax & gratuity) per person; alcohol will be additional. We will offer wine suggestions for the various courses and we plan to provide three different entrée choices for each evening, like a beef dish, a seafood dish, and a vegetarian option. We will also post menus four to six weeks out so people can whet their appetites and choose their favorites. We'll be creating some sample menus with actual pictures of the presentation in the next few weeks.

How does the prepaid credit work?

Charges (including tax and gratuity) will be applied toward the \$300 per person (\$600 per couple) until it runs out, then charges go to member account or credit card. If you only want to commit \$300 for you and your spouse, you can do so, but it will only count as one individual toward our minimum number, and we risk that the Supper Club does not happen. If for some reason you don't use the entire credit during the Nov thru Apr time frame, all is not lost; after April 30th it becomes a general food & beverage credit that can be used in the grill, snack bar, etc.

Why do you need a pre-paid commitment?

The Supper Club will only happen if we get a minimum of 150 individuals who pay the \$300 prepaid credit. This upfront financial commitment is needed to determine that there is enough member participation and support to make this effort worthwhile and to provide the dining experience you seek. In order for the Supper Club to be established, we will need the minimum number of commitments by September 15, 2010.

Will Supper Club dinners be open to the general membership if we choose not to join the Supper Club?

Before answering this question, again we should reiterate that the Supper Club won't materialize at all unless we get the minimum commitment, so we hope you don't sit back and assume the rest of the membership will make it happen. Now, to answer the question, if the Supper Club indeed happens as planned, Supper Club members will have first option to make reservations. In order to provide this special dining experience, reservations will be required (no walk-ins) and each dinner will be limited to 60-75 people. If there are still openings two days prior to the cut-off, we will allow reservations from non-Supper Club members, with a differential in pricing. All reservations will be cut off 48 hrs prior to allow for ordering, preparation and staffing.

Can I bring a guest to the Supper Club?

Supper Club members are welcome to bring guests. Our vision is the Overlook as a restaurant style room vs. a banquet hall, and to provide attentive service, we'd like to keep most of the tables at 2, 4, or 6 people. This will be a great venue to entertain your guests!

What will the Dress Code be?

The specified attire for the Supper Club will be considered "Country Club Casual". The vision is that the "food and wine experience" is fine dining quality, but the atmosphere is fun and casual. Khakis and Golf Shirts are acceptable. Jackets and ties are not required. There will be no denim allowed.

How do we sign up?

Those who wish to become Supper Club members will complete a one-page Membership Agreement, indicating if it is for an individual or couple. The Agreement will authorize the Club to bill their member account for the indicated amount (either \$300 or \$600) on their September 30, 2010 billing statement. The amount will only be billed if we have enough members for the Supper Club to move forward.
